

# Business Impact Estimate Exemption

Proposed ordinance's title/reference: **AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SEBASTIAN, FLORIDA, AMENDING LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE SECTION 54-4-21.C.4. USE RESTRICTIONS FOR OUTDOOR STORAGE FACILITIES AND MINI-STORAGE FACILITIES AS A CONDITIONAL USE IN THE TRIANGLE OVERLAY DISTRICT; LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE SECTION 54-2-6.4(28) SPECIFIC CRITERIA FOR APPROVING A CONDITIONAL USE; LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE SECTION 54-5-22.2 DEFINITION OF TERMS, NEW DEFINITION OF OUTDOOR STORAGE FACILITY; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND REPEAL OF LAWS IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR SCRIVENER'S ERRORS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**
